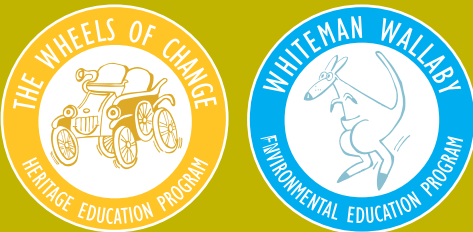

Welcome to 4,000 hectares of gently undulating land reserved for conservation, recreation and heritage activities. The Park sits over the Gngangara Water Mound in the natural bushland of the Swan Coastal Plain and is home to a number of heritage organisations and a craft village. What will you incorporate into your education program?

- Camel Rides (with 'Touch the Wild' only)
- Heritage Tram and Train Rides
- BBQs (\$1 coin operated)
- Bike and walk paths
- Sports trailer (\$25 day, \$40 full day)
- Orienteering
- Large shaded playgrounds

Most programs are between 1 and 1.5 hours long and are delivered by knowledgeable guides who are experienced in their field.

All Program bookings include complimentary shelter hire. This provides your class with a sheltered lunch base on the day of your visit.

After booking your visit you will be sent a set of teacher notes relevant to the program requested.

The teacher notes include:

- Important information to assist with your visit.
- A specific program outline with links to the curriculum.
- Teacher resource materials.

Free teacher preview passes are available on request prior to your visit.

Teachers and parent supervisors are generally admitted free of charge on a 1 to 5 ratio.

All school groups (whether booked to do a paid program or not) must register their arrival in the Park at the Visitor Information Centre in the Village.

Please note that we will also require an emergency mobile phone contact number for each school group in the Park.

TEACHER PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT.

Free teacher familiarisation sessions are held each term.

Call us to find out when the next session is being held.

CANCELLATION POLICY.

Schools unable to attend on the day will be subject to a \$25 cancellation fee. This fee will not apply if the school cancels its visit at least 7 working days prior to the visit or transfers to another day due to inclement weather.

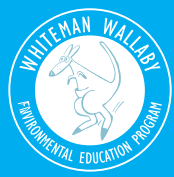

ENVIRONMENTAL PROGRAMS

Discover the wonderful secrets of the environment we live in.



1. Freshwater Creatures and the Fish Ladder

Years K-7 (min 12 children)
Friday by arrangement
Cost \$4 per child
1.5 to 2 hour session

An interactive program viewing the amazing world of macroinvertebrates at Mussel Pool.

In the absence of natural fish ladders Whiteman Park has constructed a man-made version in Bennett Brook.

Come and discover why these little fish are so important to our ecosystem and experience the fun of science in the natural environment.

Note: this is not a water excursion.

2. Touch the Wild (self-guided)

Years K-12 (min 5 children)
Monday to Friday
Cost \$8 per child
1 to 3 hour session

A popular excursion that combines a visit to explore Caversham Wildlife Park, home to many farmyard animals, native fauna and birds, with the great picnic and recreational facilities of Whiteman Park.

There are now two fabulous shows you can include in your class' visit - the 'Wombat & Friends Show' and the very Australian 'Farm Show'. Students have the opportunity to get hands-on during these engaging learning experiences. Pat a wombat, maybe bottle-feed a lamb, milk a cow or even talk to a cockatoo!

3. Snakes Alive

Years K-12 (min 25 children)
Monday to Friday by arrangement
Cost \$5.50 per child
1 hour session

Understand and observe the amazing variety of reptiles that live in Western Australia.

Students will develop an appreciation of snakes and an understanding of how they can help to protect reptiles in the natural environment.

First aid for snake bites will be taught and children will get to handle a live snake, if they dare!



TRANSPORT HERITAGE PROGRAMS

Recapture the spirit of the pioneers and the wonder of the new age.



5. Motorvation

Years 3-7 (min 10 children)
Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday
Cost \$3.50 per child
1 hour session

Travel back in time and experience the wonder of transport at the Motor Museum of Western Australia.

View over 150 vehicles including a horse drawn butcher's delivery cart and motorcars spanning the years 1898 through to 2004. There's even a DeLorean - the 'time machine' vehicle from the movie Back to the Future!

Museum staff will take you on this very special journey through more than a century of transport in WA.

4. All Aboard! "You've Got Mail"

Years K-5 (min 20 children)
Wednesday and Thursday
Cost \$5.50 per child
1 hour session

Not so long ago the train was a principal carrier and deliverer of mail.

All Aboard! is a fun interactive experience aboard a real train, where students become the 'posties' on a 6.5km run through the Park's bushlands.

Volunteers from Bennett Brook Railway will guide students through this unique historical experience. (Students are encouraged to create and bring along their own letters for sorting and delivery on the day).

6. Tractor Factor

Years K-12 (min 20 children)
Monday to Friday by arrangement
Cost \$2.50 per child
45-minute session

Set in the Tractor Museum of WA, students will see, hear and smell the machinery that played such an important part in the early life of WA. Museum volunteers will take students on a tailor-made tour, exploring the history of tractors, the steel vs rubber debate and the different types of machinery.

Older groups can even start a real engine!

7. Legs and Loads



Years K-7 (min 10 children)
Monday to Friday
Cost \$2.00 per child
1 hour session

Explore how changes to land transport have transformed lives and shaped communities - past and present. Revolutions, WA's most diverse transport museum, offers separate programs designed for three age groups:

Years K-3. How did you get to school today? Imagine going by horse and cart.

Years 3-5. Identify the advantages of public transport - trams, buses and trains.

Years 5-7. Self-reliance on the road - from off-road pack animals to 21st century cycling, pack your bags carefully!

8. Flying High



Years K-7 (min 20 children)
Monday to Friday by arrangement
Cost \$4.50 per child
1 hour show plus hands-on experience

Can you read the fine print of a newspaper from over a kilometre away? A bird of prey can!

Learn what makes birds of prey different to other birds and find out how to identify them in this hands-on and informative program.

From owls and falcons to hawks and kites, understand what makes them such an important part of our environment, and why people work so hard at protecting and rehabilitating them.

Students also have the opportunity to get up-close and personal with these high-flying predators!
