HASS - HISTORY

Transport is essential in our daily lives.

Why do we choose some forms of transport over others, and why does this change? Your students will explore our transport collection using games and stories to understand change and continuity over time. By learning to use the 'look, link, imagine' technique, they will make their own discoveries as they role-play with historic objects, dress up and props.

In this program, your Year 3 students will:

- ✓ Discover how transport has changed over time.
- ✓ Think about what is the same and what is different between transport in the past and transport in the present.
- ✓ Learn how to explore historic objects.

WHAT TO EXPECT



In our introductory 'Past or Present' games, the class will begin to think about transport past and present, change and continuity.



Your students will be introduced to the 'look, link, imagine' method of investigating objects and will have the opportunity to explore the vintage bus in the museum.



In groups, children engage in hands-on, minds-on, self-directed learning as they try out three different types of vintage transport. Independently applying the 'look, link, imagine' method, they will use their observation skills, make connections with their personal knowledge and experiences and follow their imagination as they role-play historic scenarios supported by props, historic images and dress-up.



Students will finish with a review game, *The Way We Moved*, which helps them remember and compare what they have seen and learnt at the museum.
