WELCOME TO WHITEMAN PARK'S DOG PARK

Enjoy this 2.5 acre, fully enclosed off-leash exercise area for you and your pet pooch!

FEATURES:

- Agility equipment
- Drinking sources
- Natural surroundings
- Shady seating
- Small dog area for dogs under 10kg
- Over ½ km walk path
- Double gated entry/exits
- Adjacent car parking
- Open 8.30am to 6.00pm daily





The Dog Park is a fully fenced enclosure of 2.5 hectares, complete with water points, shady seating and an obstacle course designed especially in colours that the dogs can see.

This area of 'doggie freedom' is open from 8.30am to 6.00pm daily. Use of the Dog Park is free of charge but donations are welcomed for ongoing maintenance and support of RSPCA WA.

Of course you and your four-legged friend needn't confine yourselves to the Dog Park. Your dog is welcome throughout Whiteman Park, providing he or she is kept on a lead and under control at all times.

The Dog Park is located in the Mussel Pool East recreation area, at car park 23.

Please read the Rules of Use and Dog Park Etiquette before entering the facility.







WHITEMAN PARK'S DOG PARK RULES OF USE

Please follow these simple rules to ensure that everyone's visit is a safe and pleasant experience at the Dog Park – including your dogs. Violators will be asked to leave the premises.

- Dog handlers are permitted to walk a maximum of two dogs per visit.
- Dog handlers must have visual contact with and effective control of their dog(s) at all times.
- Please clean up and dispose of dog waste in the bags provided. This is the singlemost important act to ensure the ongoing success of this facility.
- Dog(s) less than four months old are not permitted in the area.
- Dog(s) in heat or unvaccinated are also not permitted in the Dog Park.
- Declared dangerous dogs and restricted breed are not permitted in this facility.
- Please leash your dog if it exhibits distressed, frightened, aggressive or unruly behaviour, and leave immediately.
- Bicycles, skateboards and scooters are not permitted within the fenced area.
- No alcohol, glass or smoking is permitted within the Dog Park.
- Children under 14 years old must be supervised by an adult at all times.
- Professional dog training is not permitted unless approved by Park Management.
- Dog handlers remain responsible for their dogs' actions even if no injury is caused.
- Handlers enter and use the area at their own risk.

DOG PARK ETIQUETTE

- Keep your dog on the leash until you are inside the double gates of the fenced area.
- Please let your dog off the leash as soon as you enter the Dog Park. Leashed dogs may exhibit unpredictable behaviour when off-leash dogs greet them.
- Ensure you close the gates securely when you enter/leave the park.
- Call your dog away from the gates as other dogs are entering or exiting the area.
- KEEP MOVING. This will encourage dogs to see the park as neutral territory.
- Pay attention to your dogs' interations with other dogs. Be aware of potential problems.
- Be alert to other dogs' behaviours.
 Remember that other owners might not be as vigilant as you.
- Please supervise your children in the Dog Park closely, both for their safety and for the benefit of other dogs. Do not allow them to shout, tease or chase other people's dogs.
- Please refrain from picnicking inside the Dog Park, as everyone else's dogs will want a feed too.
- Don't feed treats to other dogs without permission from their owners; you may upset their dietary needs or training.
- Fill in any holes your dog creates and report damage to Whiteman Park administration on 9209 6000.
- Extend common courtesy to other users of the facility.
- Dog handlers should respect the wishes of other handlers regarding the conduct of their dog(s).
- Handlers are responsible for the behaviour of their dogs.

Remember to stay alert and focussed on your dog at all times for a safe and enjoyable outing for you both.
